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Mental Status Examination:

Marcelino came into my clinic in the afternoon. He was calm, alert, ambulatory, and cooperative with the interviewer. He was dressed in a gray shirt, dark trousers and leather shoes. He appears healthy and his clothes are neat and clean. His mood is neutral. His affect is full and appropriate. He responded to my questions in a soft-spoken but confident manner. He was able to maintain eye contact all throughout the interview. All my questions were answered in a relevant, honest, and logical manner. He was able to understand and follow instructions accurately.

He was oriented to time, place and person. His short term and long term memory was adequate. He was able to pay attention and able to concentrate adequately. His fund of knowledge is fair. Abstract reasoning is good. Estimated IQ is above average.

There is no evidence of psychotic thinking at this time. There are no delusions and no indications that auditory and/or visual hallucinations are present. There is no evidence of racing thoughts, thought blocking, word salad, loose associations and inappropriate behavior at this time.

Past Medical History:

There are no prior hospitalizations, operations, or accidents. There are also no prior psychiatric problems. He does not have hypertension, diabetes or asthma. He does not have any allergy to food or drug.

Conclusion:

The history and mental status examination indicate that Marcelino Rapayla Jr. is not suffering from any recognizable psychiatric disorder at this time.

Recommendation:

He is cleared from Psychiatry for organ donation.
